He also serves as chair of the Pacific International Center for High Technology Research in addition to the boards of numerous community service and non-profit organizations including the U.S. Japan Council, 'Ahahui Koa Ānuenue, and the Aloha Stadium Authority.

Earlier this year, EE Chair & Professor **Wayne Shiroma** was one of 66 academic inventors elected to the National Academy of Inventors' inaugural class of Senior Members. Senior Members are active faculty, scientists, and administrators at NAI Member Institutions with success in patents, licensing and commercialization. They have produced technologies that have brought, or aspire to bring, real impact on the welfare of society.

CEE Professor **V. Amarjit Singh** was also honored earlier this year by the American Society of Civil Engineers with the 2019 Construction Management Award for "innovation and research aimed at improving construction around the globe."


#### STUDENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS In April,...





# **Convention Mentorship Event**





The Concrete Canoe team placed 4th overall, and 2nd in race event points with 2nd in all races including Men's sprints, Women's sprints, Coed sprints, Men's slalom, and Women's slalom. The Sustainability event team placed 2nd, the Transportation Design event team placed 4th, the Surveying event team placed 6th, the Design Build Construction team placed 7th. the Environmental event team placed 7th, and Joshua Agpaoa placed 9th in the Technical Paper competition.

• College of Engineering students Grace Hayashi, Jaymark Ganibi, Justin Pagtolingan, Amanda Achiu, Eliesse Hihara, Benjamin Liang, and Keola Wong competed in the AUVSI (Association for Unmanned Vehicle Systems International) Student Unmanned Aerial Systems Competition at Patuxent River Naval Air Station, Maryland, where they placed 19th out of 68 teams.

• Team Hōkūlele (UH College of Engineering students Jason Borgida, Efren Enriquez, Nhue Lac, Branden Lucas, Adam James Macalalag, Matthew Nakamura, Eric Takahashi, Kobe Taylor, and Leah Toma) successfully launched and recovered the 11.5-foot rocket and payloads they built for the **Spaceport America Cup Competition** hosted by the Experimental Sounding Rocket Association in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

• A team of 10 UH College of Engineering students took a Formula One car they designed and built to Lincoln, Nebraska to compete against 80 teams from the United States,

Canada, Mexico, India and Brazil in the annual International Formula SAE (Society of Automotive Engineers) Collegiate Design Competition. They placed 40th out of 77 teams

# COLLEGE-WIDE

All of the college's graduate programs were ranked in the most recent **U.S. News and World Report** rankings. Civil engineering ranked 76 out of 152 in the nation, the electrical engineering department was 97 out of 186 schools, and mechanical engineering came in at 135 out of 181. Last fall, the college broke into the Best Undergraduate Engineering Programs category at number 146 for the first time since 2012.

The college launched some new degree programs. The College of Engineering is now offering a **Bachelor of Science in Engineering Science (BSES)** with initial concentrations in either Aerospace Engineering or Biomedical Engineering. This new degree is intended to increase the options for our students, providing an interdisciplinary education and a mechanism to cover emerging areas. Meanwhile, the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering is offering a new **Bachelor of Science in Construction Engineering (CNST)** with dedicated emphasis in the construction field of civil engineering.
