This is the mission of the Society of Women Engineers (SWE), a global organization serving over 40,000 members. The SWE Hawaiian Islands (SWE-HI) Professional Section has made great strides to demonstrate this mission in Hawai'i since its chartering in 2012.

To stimulate women to achieve their full potential as engineers and leaders, SWE-HI holds regular professional development and career management events, workshops, and webinars. SWE-HI recently held two events in collaboration with the SWE University of Hawaii at Mānoa (SWE-UHM) Collegiate Section on the topics of "Internships – Where to Find Them; Interviews – How to Ace Them; Fulltime Positions – How to Transition into Them" presented by Sarah Leony (Oceanit) and "Dancing the Fine Line Between Art and Science: Inspiring Wholesome Career Development" presented by Andrea Mansfield (Oceanit).

SWE-HI also strives to support members to achieve their full potential by recognizing them for their excellence and commitment. On April 6, 2019, two of the founding members of SWE-HI, Pearl Yamaguchi (Medtronic) and Kristen Yoshida (Belt Collins Hawaii LLC), were honored with WE Local ELITE and WE Local New

ELITE (Emerging Leader in Technology Engineering) awards, in Bellevue, Washington. This is a prestigious honor by SWE, one that recognizes women engineers who have been actively engaged in an engineering or technology profession and have proven their technical excellence as well as leadership within their community.

Both were also recognized for their continuing dedication to SWE's mission – striving to highlight the impact and importance of women in engineering across the globe, leading by example, and demonstrating that a career in engineering can be a fulfilling, rewarding pursuit for people of all genders and of any background.

SWE-HI has focused on expanding the image of the engineering profession this year by fundraising for the Section's first scholarship which will honor the memory of Mae Nakatani Nishioka. Mae was many things. She was the first woman to graduate with an engineering degree from the University of Hawai'i (UH) and to receive a Professional Engineer (PE) license in Hawai'i. She was an engineer with an accomplished and decorated career. She was the 2017 HCES Lifetime Achievement Award recipient. She was a mother and grandmother, a SWE member for over 50 years, and a mentor and role model for SWE members and UH students. She also signed the SWE-HI charter which began the first Professional SWE Section in Hawai'i in 2012. The SWE-HI fundraising campaign has received much support from Mae's family and friends, local engineering firms, and the SWE 'ohana. Mae's story was also featured in the Honolulu Star Advertiser ("Honoring the Legacy of Mae Nishioka" by Lee Cataluna) in July 2018 and the Hawaii Herald

(Women's History Month "Mae Nishioka: An Engineering Trailblazer" by Kristen Nemoto) in March 2019.

To demonstrate the value of diversity and inclusion, SWE-HI officers attended workshops at SWE conferences to learn to be even more inclusive of gender identity and ethnicity through the use of language at meetings and events. SWE-HI installed its first Hawaiian Culture Liaison, who will educate officers and members on aspects of Hawaiian culture. The Section also co-authored a proposal for a SWE-HI Asian Affinity Group in SWE.

This month, SWE-HI will host its first diversity and inclusion discussion on "More Work to Do in STEM for Diversity and Inclusion – A Conversation on Underrepresented Genders" in Honolulu, May 25, 2019 from 8:30 AM – 12:00 PM. Speakers will present topics including the māhū gender role in the Hawaiian culture, advancing nonbinary and transgender engineering students, and diversity and inclusion efforts in SWE. EAH Meeting Notes - Mar 6, 2019 Speakers: Duane Kurisu -- aio & Joel Yuen -- InSynergy

Subject: "KAHAUIKI VILLAGE - POWER-ING THE NEXT GENERATION"

Duane Kurisu was first to speak and talked about all the coordinated efforts it took to complete the Kahauiki Village project. The State was the first to provide lease free land for the site. Next came all the design efforts by the architects and engineers which were provided Pro Bono. The City waived the permitting, but the designer and contractor obtained permits anyway. Not all materials were free, but all the contractors provide some free labor and material and there were volunteer groups providing free labor. Duane showed a tear-jerker video of the thankful new residents moving in. One of the big efforts was by InSynergy the electrical and mechanical designer who designed the village to be off gird. The micro-grid has PV and batteries that can provide 100% of the village's demand. There is a connection to the grid for charging the batteries but so far they have not had to recharge from the gird.

Subject: "CLEAN WATER RINSE RACK AT **AIR STATION BARBERS POINT"**

Mike Hunnemann gave an excellent presentation on the clean water rinse rack at the US Coast Guard Barbers Point Air Station, which is used to rinse their C-130 airplanes and H-65C helicopters. Previously the planes had to be hand washed with mops on extended poles. Now the plane or helicopter taxi through the Rinse Rack after each landing. This significantly reduces corrosion due to Hawaii's salty environment

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE APRIL 2, 2019 ASME-HI GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The meeting was held in Holmes Hall, UHM, with the Francis R. Montgomery Design Competition the main topic of discussion. Thirteen teams (about 120 students) will be participating, location and time, HIB-110, May 3, 2019, 12 noon to 6 pm. With the three ME 482 instructing professors present, Drs A. Zachary Trimble, Zhuoyuan Sang, and Trevor Sorenson, changes to the competition format were discussed and approved. Changes included shortening the team oral presentation portion by 30 minutes and giving this time to the team interviews by judges. Second, allow equal time allotment for presentation regardless of team size, and third, provide general guidance to judges to provide equal time and attention to each project regardless of team size. With the three professors participating, the scoring sheet will be updated and improved with all their inputs. Four prizes will be awarded due to more than ten teams competing. Dr. Trimble will provide judges with team abstracts before the competition date.

UHCOE Professor Awarded National Honors



Professor Amarjit Singh was awarded the American Society of Civil Engineers' 2019 Construction Management Award at the annual ASCE Construction Institute Summit in Atlanta, Georgia. This prestigious award is given once a year for "inno-

vation and research aimed at improving construction around the globe."

Awarded by a large field of accomplished professionals and researchers, this accolade is granted once a year on the basis of outstanding contributions to the field of construction management as a practitioner, educator, or researcher either in the form of written presentations, scholarly work, or notable performance.

Previous recipients of this award include pioneers like John Fondahl–for his discovery of the Critical Path Method–and Robert Peurifoy–whose work revolutionized the field of Construction Management.

Dr. Singh was chosen for his many achievements in different countries, his publications on innovative and pioneering topics, and his cutting edge research on mitigating wave energies in harbors and monitoring distress in airport pavements.

Dr. Singh is also the recipient of nine *Best Paper* awards and was a 2009 recipient of the University of Hawai'i's highest teaching honorthe *Board of Regents Excellence in Teaching Medal.*

In addition to his present position as Professor of Civil Engineering, Dr. Singh is Cooperating Graduate Faculty in the Department of Public Administration, University of Hawai'i, Mānoa. He is also Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Legal Affairs and Dispute Resolution in Engineering and Construction.

He earlier served as Chairperson of the Hawai'i Council of Engineering Societies, and Director at the University of Hawaii Professional Assembly. He was elected co-chair of the All Campus Council of Faculty Senate Chairs at the University of Hawai'i.




